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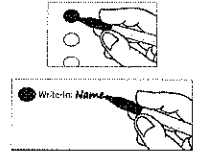

To vote for a write-in candidate, completely fill the oval to the left of the words "Write-in" and legibly print at least the first and last names of an eligible write-in candidate in the write-in area to the right. Vote like this:



WARNING: Any person who, by use of force or other means, unduly influences an eligible elector to vote in any particular manner or to refrain from voting, or who falsely makes, alters, forges, or counterfeits any mail ballot before or after it has been cast, or who destroys, defaces, mutilates, or tampers with a ballot is subject, upon conviction, to imprisonment, or to a fine, or both. Ballot questions referred by the general assembly or any political subdivision are listed by letter, and ballot questions initiated by the people are listed numerically. A ballot question listed as an "amendment" proposes a change to the Colorado constitution, and a ballot question listed as a "proposition" proposes a change to the Colorado Revised Statutes. A "yes/for" vote on any ballot question is a vote in favor of changing current law or existing circumstances, and a "no/against" vote on any ballot question is a vote against changing current law or existing circumstances.

Funding the Clear Creek County Ambulance Department services by an increase in the County sales tax rate by 0.65 percent

SHALL CLEAR CREEK TAXES BE INCREASED \$ 990,875.00 (FIRST FULL FISCAL YEAR DOLLAR INCREASE) SOLELY FOR THE LIMITED PURPOSE OF FUNDING THE OPERATING AND CAPITAL COSTS OF THE CLEAR CREEK COUNTY AMBULANCE DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE AMBULANCE, EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN AND OTHER EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES AUTHORIZED BY STATE LAW IN CLEAR CREEK COUNTY; SUCH TAX INCREASE TO CONSIST OF INCREASING THE COUNTYWIDE SALES TAX RATE BY 0.65 PERCENT, FROM THE CURRENT 1.0% TO NEW TOTAL 1.65% RATE, (WHICH REPRESENTS AN INCREASE OF SIX AND ONE-HALF CENTS ON EACH TEN DOLLAR PURCHASE), BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2018, AND ENDING ON THE JUNE 30 OR DECEMBER 31, WHICHEVER OCCURS FIRST, AFTER CLEAR CREEK COUNTY CEASES TO ORGANIZE, OWN, OPERATE, CONTROL, DIRECT, MANAGE, CONTRACT FOR OR FURNISH AMBULANCE SERVICES IN CLEAR CREEK COUNTY; WITH ALL REVENUES GENERATED FROM THE TAX INCREASE, NET OF THE COSTS OF COLLECTION, TO BE DEPOSITED INTO A SEPARATE AMBULANCE DEPARTMENT SALES TAX FUND AND SHALL CLEAR CREEK COUNTY BE ENTITLED TO COLLECT, RETAIN, AND SPEND THE FULL REVENUES FROM SUCH TAX INCREASE WITHOUT STATUTORY OR CONSTITUTIONAL LIMITATION OR CONDITION, INCLUDING ARTICLE X, SECTION 20 OF THE COLORADO CONSTITUTION, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES §29-1-301, OR ANY OTHER LAW AS IT CURRENTLY EXISTS OR AS IT MAY BE AMENDED IN THE FUTURE AND WITHOUT LIMITING IN ANY YEAR THE AMOUNT OF OTHER REVENUES THAT MAY BE COLLECTED AND SPENT BY THE COUNTY?
