Shall Article II, Section 5, Of The Charter Of The City Of Alamosa Be Amended To Allow Non-Residents Who Are Employed Full Time, Own Property, Or Own Businesses In The City Of Alamosa And Reside In Alamosa County To Serve On City Advisory Boards And Commissions, (But Not The Planning Commission Or The Personnel Board), By Amending Article II, Section 5, Of The Charter Of The City Of Alamosa To Read In Its Entirety As Follows:

Section 5. Qualifications Of Appointive Officers. No Person Shall Be Eligible For Appointment To Office As A Member Of A Board Or Commission Unless At The Time Of Appointment The Appointee (1) Is A Registered Elector Of The City; Or (2) Is A Resident Of Alamosa County And (A) Owns Property Within The City, (B) Owns A Business Located Within The City, Or (C) Is Employed Full Time Within The City. Members Of The Planning Commission And Of The Personnel Board Shall Be Registered Electors Of The City. If Any Office Holder For The City Shall Cease To Be Eligible For Appointment At Any Time During His Or Her Tenure In Office, The Office Shall Be Deemed Vacant As Of The Date Of Ineligibility.
